From the Airport

RENTAL CAR: Car rental counters are located in Terminal A.

To drive from the airport to the hotel, take **Highway 281 S**, which will turn into **I-37 S** near the downtown area. Follow I-37 S and take **exit 141C** toward **McCullough Ave/Nolan St**. Keep right at the fork, follow signs for **Brooklyn Ave/Broadway**, and merge onto **Broadway**. Turn left on **Broadway Street** and continue onto **Losoya Street**.

STREETCAR: As part of the bus service, the city operates a reproduction of a mid-20th Century rail streetcar. Stops include popular sights like the **Spanish Governor's Palace**, and the **King William Historic District**. Streetcar passes can be purchased online. Upon arriving in town, pick up a streetcar brochure in the hotel lobby.

SELF: \$10.00 plus tax per night

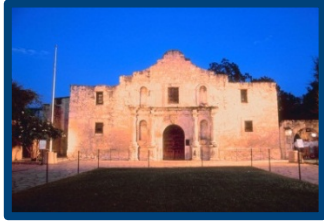

Main Attractions



THE ALAMO: Originally a Spanish mission constructed nearly 300 years ago, the Alamo later served as a military fortress during several wars. Today, it is a major tourist site most famous for the epic siege and battle in 1836 preceding the end of the Texas Revolution. The **museum** and **gardens** are open year-round from 9:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., and admission is free.

RIVER WALK: Lined by restaurants, bars, and shops, the San Antonio River Walk is a network of walkways along the banks of the San Antonio River, one story beneath the streets of downtown. Visitors can explore the winding area along riverside walkways and bridges, or via the **Rio Taxi** and **River Tours** services. Located at the head of the river is **Rivercenter Mall**, host to over 100 retailers and restaurants.

MARKET SQUARE: Known to house the largest Mexican market outside of Mexico, Market Square is an historic outdoor plaza where visitors can shop for **handmade art**, clothing, fresh produce, and much more. **Live entertainment**, restaurants, and a museum make Market Square a vibrant cultural hub of the city.

TOWER OF THE AMERICAS & HEMISFAIR PARK: A 750-foot tall observation tower and restaurant, the Tower of the Americas was built as a focal point for the 1968 World's Fair. Today it boasts an observation deck, a **fine-dining restaurant**, and a 4-D theater ride, *Skies Over Texas*.
