## CCFSSE / CCSSE Crosswalk

The following crosswalk includes similar items from the Community College Faculty Survey of Student Engagement (*CCFSSE*) and the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (*CCSSE*). While *CCSSE* results may be used for internal review, benchmarking, and accreditation, *CCFSSE* results can strengthen these endeavors and highlight areas for future faculty development.

The Student and Faculty Frequency Distributions report, available on the *CCFSSE* tab of the *CCSSE* online reporting system, displays faculty perceptions of student engagement alongside student responses. Colleges may use this crosswalk along with the Student and Faculty Frequency Distributions report to identify areas of strength and to recognize challenges that merit further consideration. It is important to remember, however, that the side-by-side tables, while illustrative, are not entirely equivalent: *CCSSE* asks students to report perceptions and experiences across the period of the current academic year. Faculty members, in contrast, are asked to describe their practices in a specific course.

The comparison of student and faculty responses provides a useful prompt for campus discussions, particularly in those areas where students and faculty seem to be reporting divergent perceptions of the same experience. This crosswalk can be used in conjunction with the "Faculty Prediction Exercise," also available in the <u>Tools section</u> of the *CCSSE* website, to prompt discussion on these differences.
