From the Airport

Rental Car: Car rental counters are located in the Consolidated Car Rental Facility, across from Terminal B

[To drive from the airport to the hotel](#), take **US-281 S** and continue onto **I-37 S/US-281 S** near the downtown area. Follow I-37 S and take **exit 141C** toward **McCullough Ave/Nolan St**. Continue straight onto **Elm St** (signs for Nolan St/Houston St), and turn right onto **6th St**. Turn left on **Broadway St** and turn right on **E Travis St**. The destination will be on the **left**.

Taxi: Taxi cabs are available at outer commercial curbside at Terminal A. Approximate fare between the airport and downtown is \$25–\$29.

Getting Around the City

Taxi: Up to six people can ride in a taxi. Wheelchair accessible vans are available.

Rideshare: Several rideshare companies operate in San Antonio, including Uber and Lyft.

Hotel Parking

Parking at The St. Anthony is available to all guests. The following discounted rates apply.

SELF: \$19.00 plus tax per car on the event day .

OVERNIGHT VALET: \$31.20 + tax per car/day.

Main Attractions



THE ALAMO: Originally a Spanish mission constructed nearly 300 years ago, the Alamo later served as a military fortress during several wars. Today, it is a major tourist site most famous for the epic siege and battle in 1836 preceding the end of the Texas Revolution. The museum and gardens are open from 9:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., and admission is free.



RIVER WALK: Lined by restaurants, bars, and shops, the San Antonio River Walk is a network of walkways along the banks of the San Antonio River, one story beneath the streets of downtown. Visitors can explore the winding area along riverside walkways and bridges, or via the Rio Taxi and River Tours services. Located at the head of the river is Rivercenter Mall, host to over 100 retailers and restaurants.



MARKET SQUARE: Enjoy the sights and flavors of old Mexico at Historic Market Square, a favorite of locals and tourists for generations. Explore over 100 locally owned shops and stalls, all at a festive indoor mall famously described as the largest Mexican market outside Mexico.



TOWER OF THE AMERICAS: Located in downtown San Antonio, the 750-foot-tall Tower of the Americas provides guests the most spectacular view of the Alamo City. Enjoy the panorama from the Chart House Restaurant or take in the scenery from the Observation Deck.
